Chairmans Report - AGM 2024

The highlight of the past year was our very successful Abrail24. This was the Club's first 2 day show and was staged to mark the 50th Anniversary of ADMRC. Trevor, as Exhibition Manager, worked very hard to book 40 outstanding layouts and Peter did his usual sterling job of booking traders. The show was a great success and this success was in no small measure due to Trevor's efforts. However, I must pay tribute to the support and hard work of all Club Members in putting on Abrail24. It was expensive to put on the show with overnight accommodation and travel expenses of the exhibitors making a significant element of our outgoings. We made a small profit but many lessons have been learned as we prepare for Abrail25. It was pleasing to have a unanimous vote at the post partem for a 2 day show in 2025. For my part, I do not mind admitting that at times during the run up to the show and as expenses mounted, I was concerned that the Club might suffer an ill afforded loss. How wrong I was! My sincere thanks to all Members.

As part of the 50th Anniversary celebrations we held a Families Day to which all Members' families were invited to see where we spend our Friday evenings, other days and evenings pursuing our hobby. It was very well attended with a BBQ and refreshments for all. As always, the ladies did a great job supporting the event. And a good time was had by all. We have started our monthly "Modelling Evenings" and they have been very well received. It is an opportunity for Members to learn modelling techniques from more experienced Members.

I am sorry to be losing Peter as Club Secretary. It has been a pleasure working with him and I have relied many times on his expertise and wisdom regarding Club affairs. I am very pleased that he is continuing as a Club Member and I know that whoever succeeds him as Secretary can rely on Peter's enthusiastic support.

In spite of the number of buildings on our site we are short of storage space! We have acquired 2 layouts in the past year, N gauge and Z gauge both bequeathed to the Club. The N gauge layout is partly built and probably beyond salvaging unless some member wants to take it on or take up the track. Quite a lot of stock came with the N gauge layout and can perhaps be used on Didcot or Three Bridges and if not offered to members to purchase. The Z gauge layout is operational and can be developed if a suitable band of volunteers can be found. We also have Millanford which belongs to a former member and Chairman of the Club who, sadly, has developed dementia. This layout is currently dismantled. We really do need to review our storage and what we want to keep and what to discard. It has been suggested we might investigate obtaining a shipping container. You will recall we did have one which was in poor repair which was dismantled by James and Steve and disposed of. The monthly Working Day is well established and is held on the last Saturday of every month even if the last Saturday falls on a Bank Holiday Weekend. The Work Programme is expertly overseen by Chris Maycock.

Our next Exhibition is in Didcot on 31 August. Plans are well in hand and Dominic is booking layouts whilst Peter is organising Traders. In addition, we expect to have a day at Millets Farm entertaining the public and hopefully recruiting new members.

Overall, a good year and I am pleased to say the Club is thriving. But we cannot relax in our efforts to recruit new members and to organise activities to help new, and current, members develop their modelling skills and of course to run trains.

Layout Report - Bishop's Hill

The development of Bishop's Hill continues but more slowly than we would like. Track circuits are in place and point work is fully functional. It is pleasing to see trains running and giving enjoyment to Members.

The "Village Corner" is at an advanced stage thanks to John Winchester and the "Industrial Site" is being developed by Stephen Usher. The Station Building is almost ready to be placed in position thanks to Graham Hadingham.

- Platforms to be Covered in
- Platform Canopies to be constructed

- The area around the Engine Shed with Coaling Tower, Ash Plant and Turntable to be finished.
